- And of course quality teaching and learning in our classrooms!

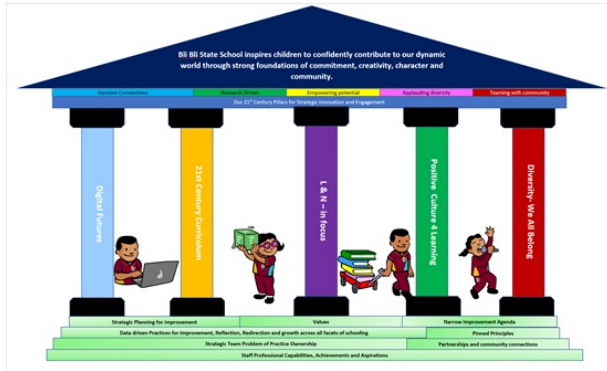
Many thanks to our parents, carers and support crews who have also been tirelessly supporting our events and activities this term.

Journey of Improvement – a quick update

Our continued journey, focusing on ensuring we are meeting the needs of our 21st century learners has certainly continued to grow, and gain momentum in Term 2.

As a school community we have committed to continuing to build our school into a modern innovative learning place for our students, and the changes we are making will take time to evolve, it is so pleasing to see growth in each of the key areas we are utilising to ensure we continue to meet

the needs of our current and future students.



Here is a brief snapshot of what we are working on...

Digital Futures

We have employed our STEAM teacher, Mr McClure on a fulltime basis in 2024 to continue to support the utilisation of technologies within our key curriculum areas. The work being produced by our students is amazing. Our upper school students have also participated in a project with USC which included a great parent night, which was well attended.



Our team continues to work towards improving our access to technology, with our switches being replaced and our cabling upgraded as we continue to wait impatiently for arrival and installation of our new wifi system. Whilst we know there are many schools in the line for this upgrade, we have certainly moved closer to the top of the list. We have also continued to upgrade our devices and apps to ensure we are providing quality resources for our students and staff. This year has also seen iPads rolled out to all teachers to promote consistent classroom use of these devices.

Our team is currently also working through the new departmental platform 'QLearn' in conjunction with our Curriculum Team.

21st Century Curriculum

Our team continues to work with the updated Australian Curriculum, known as version 9. We have begun planning and trialling units based on Version 9, ready for the full implementation of particular learning

areas commencing in 2025.

L & N in Focus

Our team's focus this year is **READING**, and using evidence-based practices to improve our students ability to read accurately with confidence.

We have invested in an internationally recognised Australian whole school approach named **PLD**:

PLD's Structured Synthetic Phonics Teaching Overview

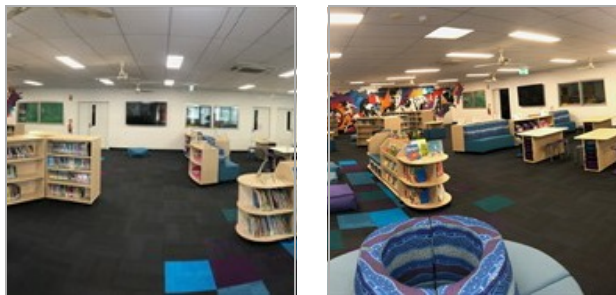
PLD's Structured Synthetic Phonics (SSP) program is an Australian evidence-based whole-school offering that is aligned with the Science of Reading. The PLD teaching sequence commences with initial (simple) code and gradually introduces extended code. All of the PLD programs are supported by downloadable teaching sequences and companion screening and tracking manuals for each primary school year level: [Early Years](#), [Foundation](#), [Year 1 & 2](#) and [Year 3, 4, 5 & 6](#).

Our staff have undergone an extensive range of

professional development and have worked very hard to continue the implementation of this program across all year levels in 2024.

We have also purchased a large number of resources and reading books to support the program.

Our team also took on the task of upgrading our library into an active modern space for our students and staff. It is now a highly popular area of our school with many children wanting to access and enjoy the new space.



Positive Culture 4 Learning

Our team continues to review and analyse our data to promote positive Buzz lessons each week, reminding students of our clear school behaviour expectations.

We have been participating in professional learning sessions to assist in our knowledge and understanding of 'trauma' and the impact it can have on children, including their behaviour and ability to learn. We continue to focus on the amazing students here at our school who just continue to do the right thing. We are also very proud of the students who are now becoming 'upstanders', who don't accept other students being unkind to peers. We always urge students to report concerns to an adult so that we can help resolve issues proactively.



We have also added in 'Respectful Relationship' lessons across Years 5 and 6 to assist our students in developing and maintaining positive relationships with their peers. The program also focuses on key concepts to support personal growth and development including self image, respect, perseverance, rights of self and others, and a range of areas to prepare our students for their future, including the transition to high school.

Diversity – We all belong

Our team has been working towards a clear definition of 'diversity' for our school. We want all in our community to feel like they belong at our school. We have also been working with our staff to ensure we are engaging with the latest research and departmental approaches to support gender diversity within and beyond our school.



Our team is currently working very closely with a range of other local schools to establish stronger links with our community and colleagues to support our Indigenous students. We have also opened our 'Wunya Room' in 2024 to

offer community support for our students and families. Mrs Wendy Gaines works from this space and is a key member of our teaching staff who helps with the implementation of Indigenous perspectives within our curriculum. All our staff engaged in great professional development at the commencement of the year to continue to build our knowledge and understanding.

We are very excited with the work that we are doing and look forward to seeing the positive impact this will have on our students, staff and families as we continue to move our school forward. We also use our regular P&C meetings as a way to share our progress and encourage all parents to get involved with this amazing group of volunteers who are helping us make a big difference in the life of every child who steps through our gates.

Illness

We are aware of the high number of viruses that are currently impacting our families. Please remember if your child is ill they should stay home. Hopefully with the upcoming break we will get on top of the illnesses that are lurking across our community. 

HOW TO ENROL?
We have an online enrolment system for your convenience. Just head over to our website at www.blibli.qld.edu.au and click on the link to enrolment forms. Once you have submitted your enrolment form, we will process your application (generally within 10 to 15 business days). Once your application has been processed, we will send you a confirmation letter with further information about our service and to organise a convenient time that suits you for an enrolment meeting to discuss your enrolment with us.

QParents

QParents is a user-friendly portal accessible via an app or web browser, providing parents with secure online access to information about your child's state schooling.

QParents allows you to access and manage information online about your child including:

- Attendance details
- Digital Consent
- Timetables and upcoming events
- Report cards and assessments
- Invoices and payment history
- Student consent details

QParents will assist both staff and parents in sharing

and responding to information in an efficient and effective way.

It won't replace the traditional ways you communicate with our school, but it will provide another way to communicate with us!

What are the benefits of using QParents?

You will benefit from:

- greater transparency with online access to your child's information
- ease of viewing and updating your child's details including address and medical conditions
- reduction in calls made direct to your school to pay invoices or report absences
- anytime, anywhere 24/7 online access on a smart phone, tablet or computer
- access to the latest information in one central place

What do you need to do to get started?

We sent out emails inviting parents/guardians to become a QParents Account Owner (QPAO) for your student/s.

A QPAO is a person who has been nominated and invited by their child's school to update and view their child's information in QParents. More than one parent can be nominated and invited by the school to become a QPAO.

QPAOs will also be able to invite other people (such as another family member), to view the student's information. Once invited, these people can register for QParents as "delegated viewers". A delegated viewer can see the student's details, but cannot make updates.

When you receive your invitation email or letter, simply follow the instructions to register your QParents account. The process should take less than 10 minutes to complete.

Invitations sent by email will only ever come from no.reply@qparents.qld.edu.au. You will not be invited to register from any other email address or organisation.

Safe and secure

QParents is a secure portal that meets strict industry standards. The Department of Education considers

student information to be confidential (it is classified as PROTECTED by the Department). Only people with the right to access information about your child will be given an account.

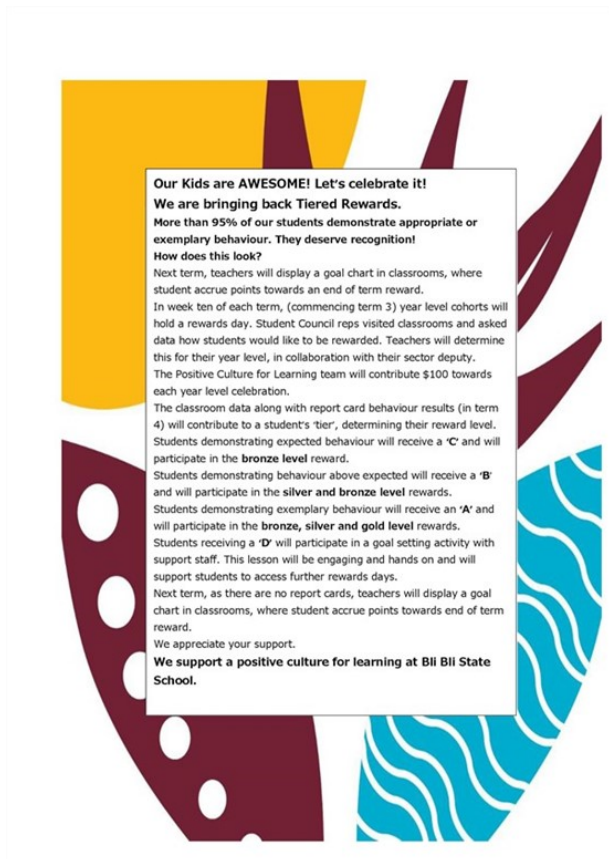
