Digital Futures

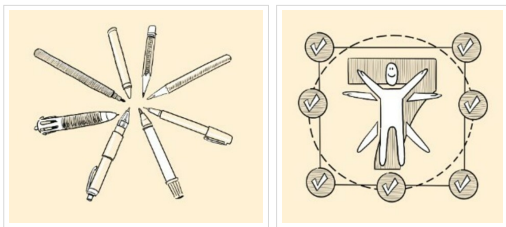

We have also ensured that our students continue to receive support within our classrooms to improve literacy and numeracy skills.



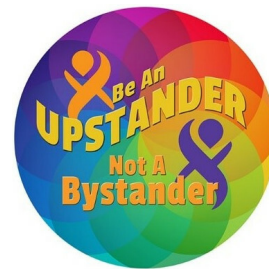
Keep studying, kids

Each year the school organises a visit from the Life Education Program. Life Education Queensland offers individual modules for each of our year levels, different from year to year.

All modules are aligned with the Australian curriculum for health and physical activity and are developed to support teachers reach these specific learning outcomes. The modules empower children with the skills they need to make healthier lifestyle choices.

The program provides students with age appropriate health and safety knowledge, skills and strategies to counter peer and social pressures, an understanding of how values and attitudes can influence lifestyle choices and behaviour, interactive print and online teacher and student resources with lesson plans and activities, and animated videos with relevant themes.

So, from 12 - 20 July our classes from Prep to Year 4 will enjoy a session with teacher, Jenny and Harold the giraffe.

DIVERSITY NEWS



FACT SHEET FOR PARENTS, GUARDIANS AND CARERS

WHAT IS THE NCCD?

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) takes place every year.

The NCCD is a collection that counts:

- the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability
- the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students.

Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability. This 'help' allows them to access education on the same basis as a child without disability. The NCCD uses the definition of disability in the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992*.

Schools provide this information to education authorities.

Go to *What is a reasonable adjustment?* below to learn about adjustments.

WHY IS THIS DATA BEING COLLECTED?

All schools in Australia must collect information about students with disability.

The NCCD:

- ensures that the information collected is transparent, consistent and reliable
- provides better information that improves understanding of students with disability
- allows parents, guardians, carers, teachers, principals, education authorities and government to better support students with disability.

Student with disability loading

Funding from the Australian Government for students with disability is based on the NCCD through the student with disability loading.

Students with disability who are counted in the top three levels of the NCCD (extensive, substantial and supplementary) attract the loading. Funding is based on a per-student amount at each of the three levels of additional support. The amount of the loading reflects the level of support students with disability need to participate fully in school, with higher funding for those who need higher levels of support.

Australian Government recurrent school funding is provided as a lump sum to school authorities including state and territory governments, which can then distribute the funding to their member schools according to their own needs-based arrangements.

The Government expects schools and school systems to consider their funding from all sources (i.e. Australian Government, state and territory and private) and prioritise their spending to meet the educational needs of all of their students, including students with disability.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF THE NCCD FOR STUDENTS?

The information collected by the NCCD helps teachers, principals, education authorities and governments to better support students with disability at school.

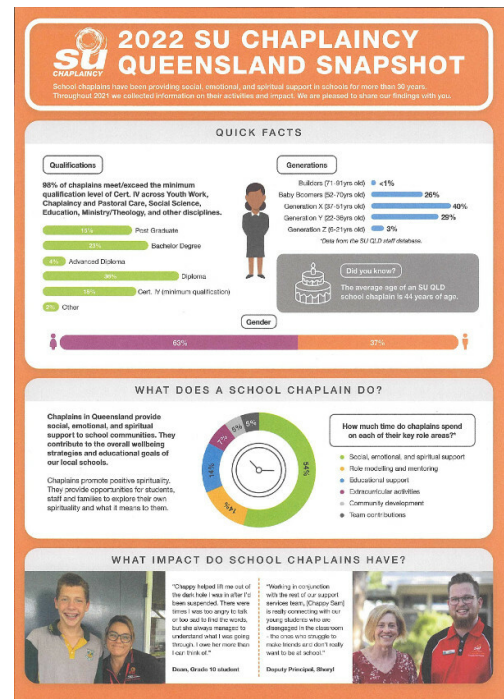
The NCCD encourages schools to review their learning and support systems and processes. This helps schools to continually improve education outcomes for all students.
